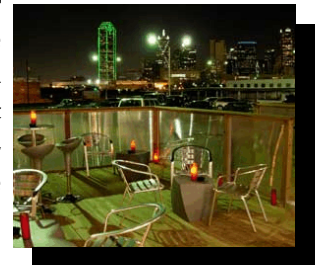
NEWS BY CHARLES
